Orthoptists in Australia


- Vision screening
- Work with ophthalmologists: strabismus, ocular motility, binocular vision, refractive surgery (laser)
- Ocular plastics (orbit, eye lids, tear ducts, face) associated with cancer and other pathologies
- Vitro-retinal clinics
- Other medical procedures, surgeries
- Orthoptic-led clinics
- Centre for Eye Research
- Medical reps: ophthalmic and low vision equipment; pharmaceuticals


Learn about epilepsy

- Multiple disabilities might include epilepsy
- Get to know seizure types
- How does epilepsy affect your client?



Focal to bilateral tonic-clonic





Aware = Awareness during the seizure, knowledge of self and environment, consciousness is intact.

Unclassified = Seizures with patterns that do not fit into the other categories or there is insufficient information to classify the seizure

CVI Range

- Developed by an O&M specialist Christine Roman-Lantzy
- Identifies key characteristics of Cortical Visual Impairment
- A good entry-point to learning about CVI
- Gives some guidance about appropriate intervention at different stages
- O&M Specialists and parents find it useful
- BUT, CVI is complex. The universality needed for measurement means that the CVI Range:
- Doesn't explore the client's unique CVI characteristics
- Doesn't explain the reasons for the client's visual behaviours
 - ... so, refer to a low vision orthoptist for a full CVI assessment
